



WHO IS GEORGIA PET FOUNDATION?

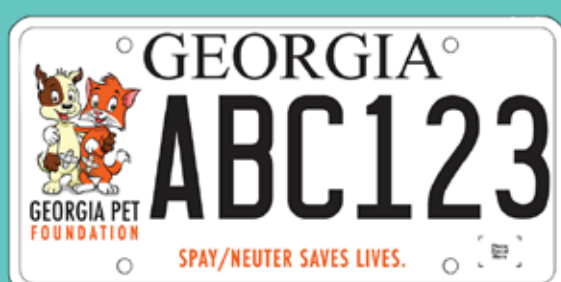
Georgia Pet Foundation is focused on ending pet overpopulation in Georgia by supporting spay-neuter programs and conducting public education initiatives.

GPF was established as a 501(c)(3) non profit organization in April 2016 when Governor Deal signed legislation approving the new Georgia Pet Foundation specialty license plate.



WHAT IS GEORGIA PET FOUNDATION DOING?

Georgia Pet Foundation is raising funds through the sale of our specialty tag to fund eligible, statewide spay-neuter programs in an effort to eliminate pet overpopulation and the euthanasia of healthy and treatable cats and dogs.

ALTERNATIVE SPAY/NEUTER TAG

- \$20 Annual License Reg. Fee
- \$1 to the County Tag Agent
- \$10 to Sponsoring Organization
- \$49 to State of Georgia General Treasury

Georgia Pet Foundation is not encumbered by political maneuvering, so we will award funds based on the most effective programs and to those areas that are particularly under-served.
